NCEA RESULTS

NCEA results notices for senior students will not be mailed out to all learners automatically. Those who have logged in on the NZQA website before 31 December and ordered a results notice will receive it in mid-January. There is no charge for results notices. Later orders will take a bit longer to process. However, results can be viewed online, under candidate login, after they are released in January by NZQA.

UNIFORM

RULES: All Year 12 students must be in the new school uniform. All items are available from SAS Sportswear, Trust Stadium, Central Park Drive, Henderson (see separate flyer enclosed). You are able to lay-by items and collect in January. The shop at Trust Stadium will be open from 9th January 2017. Hours are Monday, Tuesday 10.00am – 6.00pm. Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 9.00am – 5.00pm. Saturday 9.00am – 2.00pm. Uniform will be sold from the Waitakere Rugby Clubrooms which is located downstairs in the Trust Stadium during January.

Black, standard leather lace-up school shoes all year.

Black slip-on shoe with one band over the top. The brand name and style recommended is Cassini "Isolate", only purchased from our uniform suppliers. Similar shoes from other outlets are acceptable but they must be leather, i.e. they can be polished, and have one band over the top.

SHOES are plain black with no extra colour, decoration or labelling. No sandals. No sports shoes. No canvas shoes. No boots of any description.

SHOES (Boys) **Black**, standard leather lace-up school shoes all year. Shoes are plain black with no extra colour, decoration or labelling. No sandals. No sports shoes. No canvas shoes. No sneakers. **No boots of any description.**

SOCKS Girls: **WHITE** ankle socks to be worn with shoes. In winter black pantyhose may be worn with skirts.

SCHOOL DONATION

- (a) \$150 for one child in a family. For two or more children in a family the total cost would be \$200. ***If paid by 1 March 2018*** the amounts reduce by 20% to \$120 for one child, \$160 for two or more children.
- (b) Automatic Payments to ASB 12-3085-0185051-00 can be set up soon after enrolling to cover related costs of starting secondary school. A regular payment of \$25 for example per fortnight can be used to pay for subject fees and related charges likely to arise during the school year. STATIONERY

Stationery will need to be purchased prior to your child starting school. If purchasing online when you reach checkout please select Massey High School as your designated school of support. If purchasing instore please use the following code **BYSJ36I** which will enable Massey High School to earn points towards valuable teaching resources.

SUBJECT CHARGES

Enclosed is a list of subjects and related charges as applicable. If your child is timetabled in any of these subjects, please arrange for payment through our Bursars' office. Subject fees need to be paid for all courses before the commencement of classes. Some courses which have significantly higher fees can cause a high cost to the school if unpaid by students. For this reason, students with subject fees left unpaid when classes commence may be removed from such courses and asked to choose one or more other subjects, or alternatively to organise prompt payment of the fee(s) or to setup a payment plan through the Bursars office. If your child has chosen subjects at another level please have them pick up the fee payment invoice for that level from the school office.
