## Welcome to the Yr 11 Pre-Building Academy.

### **Nau mai ki te Whare Aronui o Tiriwa. The Pre-Building Academy welcomes you.**

This academy operates at Level 1 and takes place one hour every day. This course covers skills in communication, maths, quality standards, workshop procedures, job specifications, health and safety, materials knowledge, hand tools, power tools, and operating fixed machinery. This will lead students to the Carpentry Academy (Yr 12), and the Building Academy, (Yr 13). The course will consist of several projects, for example making a set of steps and a coffee table. This course can be combined with the Multi Skills academy, which teaches complementary skills but is overlaid on a normal timetable. (Over laid means the students come out of their normal classes for the one day a week when the Multi Skills course is running. Students will need to catch up on the work they miss on the day Multi Skills takes place).

The Pre-Building Academy is the first step towards a construction apprenticeship, or a career in a similar field.

Students will gain skills in basic workshop techniques, apply knowledge of safe working practices, use hardware and fastenings, increase their knowledge of construction materials, and make garden furniture during the course. It is primarily a practical course with a self-managing aspect.

All the standards covered in this course will contribute to the Level 1 NCEA qualification and the standards are moderated by BCATS, Building, Carpentry and Allied Trades Industry Training Organisation, (ITO).
