What is New Zealand Scholarship?

- An award that recognises top secondary school students.
- They are assessments that are designed to be challenging for the most able students in each subject. It is the pursuit of academic excellence at the highest possible secondary school level.
- Assessment is by either a written or spoken examination or by the submission of a portfolio or report of work produced throughout the year.
- It's an opportunity for you to expand on your subject knowledge be more in-depth, link more ideas together, one step higher than NCEA Level 3.



Who gains Scholarship?

- Scholarship awards are awarded to the top 3% of candidates each year
- Outstanding Scholarship awards are awarded to the top 0.3% of candidates each year

Why choose to do a Scholarship Exam?

- Recognising Excellence
- Shows Universities and Employers your dedication and perseverance
- NZ Scholarship is a monetary award
 - Premier Award: top 7 to 12 candidates. 3+ Outstanding Scholarships in the same year: \$10,000 each year for up to 3 years
 - Outstanding Scholar Award: next 40-60 top candidates. 3+ Scholarships with at least
 2 Outstanding in the same year: \$5,000 each year for up to 3 years
 - Scholarship Award: 3+ in the same year or 2 Outstanding Scholarships: \$2,000 each year for up to 3 years
 - Top Subject Scholar Award: \$2,000 per year for up to 3 years
 - Single Subject: a one-off \$500 payment, for up to two subjects


